You have been selected to participate in the *Environment and Intestinal Health Study* initiated by a team of researchers from the Institut national de la recherche scientifique (INRS) and the Centre hospitalier universitaire Sainte-Justine. This study aims to better understand the factors responsible for inflammatory bowel diseases and their role during different life stages. The Institut de la statistique du Québec (Statistique Québec) has been mandated to carry out this study, which includes both people who have had these diseases and those who have not.

Statistique Québec will call you in the next few days to complete a 30-minute questionnaire. If you are not available when we call, simply let us know what time would be more convenient for you. Prior to answering the phone questionnaire, we suggest that you complete the attached document. This way, the call will be shorter, as certain questions may require some research on your family and friends.

Additional information

Why was I chosen for the study?

You have been selected from a group of people born in Québec between 1970 and 1974. Please note that this study is aimed both at people who have inflammatory bowel diseases and people who do not.

We have obtained from the Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec (RAMQ) the contact information necessary to carry out the study under an agreement approved by the Commission d'accès à l'information (CAI) in accordance with the *Act respecting Access to documents held by public bodies and the Protection of personal information*.

Do I have to participate in this study?

Your participation in the study is voluntary, but **important**, as it will contribute to a greater understanding of the links between life trajectories and some inflammatory bowel diseases, as well as how to prevent these diseases.

Quality monitoring

For quality and training purposes, phone conversations with Statistique Québec agents are recorded. However, if you don't want the call to be recorded, simply mention it at the beginning of the call.

Confidentiality and data transmission

This study is being conducted in accordance with the *Act respecting the Institut de la statistique du Québec*. Statistique Québec has signed an agreement with the INRS and the Centre hospitalier universitaire Sainte-Justine, to whom the collected data will be transmitted with the exception of your name, address and telephone number. For research purposes, researchers from these institutions have been approved by the CAI to match this information with information from files in the provincial health system. Your information will remain **confidential** and will be used only for statistical purposes.

Ethics

An ethical evaluation of the study was conducted by the INRS and by an ethics committee mandated by Statistique Québec. The committee is responsible for safeguarding the respect, dignity and integrity of those participating or included in the study.

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Preparatory document for phone interview

About the study

At the request of the Institut national de recherche scientifique (INRS) and the Centre hospitalier universitaire Sainte-Justine, the Institut de la statistique du Québec (Statistique Québec) is conducting this study on the intestinal health of Quebecers.

The objective of this study is to better understand the factors related to intestinal health and their role during different life periods.

Confidentiality

The study is being carried out under the *Act respecting the Institut de la statistique du Québec*. Statistique Québec has entered into an agreement with the INRS and the Centre hospitalier Sainte-Justine to whom the information collected will be sent, with the exception of your name, address and telephone number. All your information will be kept confidential and will be used for statistical purposes only.

For quality and training purposes, telephone conversations with Statistique Québec interviewers will be recorded. If you do not want the conversation to be recorded, you can notify the interviewer of your refusal at the start of the call.

Instructions

- ▶ **Do not return this questionnaire by mail.** Since many of the study questions require some preparation, it is strongly recommended that you first complete the paper version of this document. Save it for the phone interview.
- ▶ Statistique Québec will contact you by phone as of October 2020 so that you can answer a questionnaire of approximately 30 minutes. If you are not available at that time, you can let us know a more convenient time for you.
- ▶ This document contains six sections. The first four sections require preparation on your part. You will need to provide that information to the interviewer as you answer the questionnaire over the phone. In the last two sections, you will find answer choices for questions that will be asked over the phone.

Section 1 Life-history calendar

In the first part of this questionnaire, we'll ask you questions to establish your life-history calendar. These questions will focus on where you lived, your studies, your work, and some important life events. You can refuse to answer a question at any time.

The life-history calendar will then help you answer other questions by helping you remember the information we want to collect, and linking certain periods of your life to important events. The questions in the life-history calendar cover the period from your birth until you turn 44.

Answer as best as you can according to what you remember. Indicate the age you were at the time of the event (e.g. 33 years) or the year in which it occurred (e.g. 1990).

Residential history

- Daycare attendance


Moreover, there will be questions on your biological parents such as:


